Bike & Pedestrian Safety Education

Walking and bicycling have increased throughout Michigan.
Unfortunately, bicycle and pedestrian traffic does not always mix well with motorized traffic.

The League of Michigan Bicyclists, in conjunction with The Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP), presents:

- An overview of the laws and what is expected for each type of traffic mode
- Recommended traffic skills for interaction between motorized and nonmotorized traffic on the road
- Most effective law enforcement actions
- How to properly analyze and report bicycle and pedestrian crashes on the UD-10
- And to increase community benefit, an additional **2.5-hour hands-on optional training is included**, covering how to organize a children's bicycle rodeo, which is an important tool for educating area residents on how to bicycle safely around town

Whether on patrol by foot, car, motorcycle, or bicycle, your officers will benefit from this 4-hour course, co-presented with the Michigan State Police and accredited by the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES).

- More than 19,000 bicyclists have been involved in motor vehicle crashes in the same time frame.
- Vulnerable roadway users such as pedestrians, bicyclists, and individuals with disabilities make up a disproportionately large percentage of fatalities on Michigan roadways.
